
Few of us will ever make or use a stone tool. Yet this technology, first developed 3.3 million years ago, was fundamental for human existence until very recently. Many of these skills were completely lost and only rediscovered in the 20th century by archaeologists, hobbyists, and other knowledge keepers. Stone toolmaking involves techniques called flintknapping, which manipulates basic physics to create diverse shapes and designs. Professor Werner is an avid and skilled stone toolmaker. He'll explain how stone-age tools are made and demonstrate some of the key techniques. Professor Werner will be offering this presentation in May or June.



There's more to a movie or TV plot than meets the eye; Canadian prop king Dean Goodine could be lurking in the shadows, ensuring everything is ready and in tip-top shape for the stars on the feature film, from showing them how to use the guns and firearms in the Westerns to detailing the food to be served in a restaurant scene.

You won't want to miss the opportunity to meet this remarkable Canadian prop master, who has agreed to



travel from his home in Summerland to share with SLR members his experiences on scores of popular movie sets including such well-known flicks as The Unforgivable, The Mountain Between Us, The Edge and Passchendale, Legends of the Fall and Unforgiven, to name a few. During his 36-plus years in the film industry he's rubbed elbows with dozens of Hollywood idols from Clint Eastwood to Gene Hackman and boasts decades of use of weapons and firearms on the sets without incident.

"Props are integral to the success of any movie or TV show," he writes in his recent book, *They Don't Pay Me to Say No.* 

"Weapons, books, newspapers, eyeglasses, military gear, medical equipment—virtually anything that a character holds, reads, uses, or shoots on screen is provided by the props department. The right prop can become an iconic plot point on which the entire story pivots, turning that item into a fabled piece of Hollywood history. The wrong prop can expose a film or a TV show as a shoddy production, making the story more laughable than believable."






